## PURPOSE OF THE ISSP FORUM

The ISSP Forum was established after the development and adoption of the Informal Settlement Support Framework by the Western Cape Government. The Department of Human Settlements, in collaboration with other stakeholders, has decided follow a specific path to respond to the paradigm shifts:

- Informal settlements are a more enduring feature of the provincial landscape than generally appreciated
- There is a lack of clear and coherent understanding and response from the sector involved in planning for informal settlements
- Informal settlement communities are inadequately involved in the planning and decision making processes
- Non-state actors (the private sector & NGOs) are inadequately utilised in responding more effectively to informality



In an attempt to address the needs of informal settlement communities, the WCDHS, in partnership with various municipalities and stakeholders, created the ISSP Forum for collaboration and partnership opportunities that will put this Province on a path to transform all informal settlements into liveable, integrated sustainable and resilient neighbourhoods by 2030.

The purpose of ISSP Forum is to facilitate the implementation of the Western Cape strategic priorities in accordance with the shifts identified in the ISSP and ultimately Outcomes 8 directives through the following approaches:

- Primarily, enhancing inter-governmental coordination and alignment with regard to the implementation of the comprehensive plan for the upgrading of informal settlements;
- Creating space for dialogue on pertinent issues between the public and private sector (including academia, Non-Governmental Organisations and independent consultants who are role players in the informal settlement upgrade space.);
- Utilising a "whole of society" approach to battle challenges faced in informal settlements on a scale that encourages participatory planning.



## PROGRAMME: 8<sup>TH</sup> ISSP FORUM - 17 MAY 2019

The Chairperson Mr Thando Mguli opened the meeting and welcomed all attendees, including Mr Shemu Nyirenda from the Eastern Cape Department of Human Settlements. Mr Mguli also thanked Mr Bongani Ketelo and the NUSP team for assistance with securing the venue.

As the chairperson, Mr Thando Mguli, Head of Department at Western Cape Human Settlements, set the scene of the meeting by providing background to the audience. He emphasized the urgency of accelerated service delivery to informal settlement communities. In his address, he elaborated on the need to upscale interventions toward these communities to restore their dignity and provide the necessary services for their livelihood and survival.
